

BARBARA DINHAM The Pesticide Puzzle

Barbara Dinham was until recently the Director of Pesticide Action Network UK. Her research showed the market pressures to increase the use of pesticides and their significant effects on both the livlihood and health of poor communities. She is currently researching the pressures to bring back DDT to combat malaria.

Melissa Holding is a musician and composer who lives in Oxford and trained in Japan on the koto (traditional Japanese harp). She is one of England's leading practitioners on this instrument. She plays both traditional and contemporary music on the koto.

He was a Labour Government Minister 1974-79. He was Director of Greenpeace UK (1985-2000).
