After the successful Cirencester producer conference in December 2006 the Organic Research Centre – Elm Farm is pleased to announce that a second conference is confirmed for the 10th and 11th December 2007 at the Royal Agricultural College, Cirencester.

The programme is entirely producer focused and the parallel workshops will to a great extent be planned and organised by producers themselves. There will be the same five strands to the workshops – growers, poultry, arable, dairy and beef & sheep – and these can combine to run joint sessions on matters of common interest.

Some of the topics to be covered are feed availability, its price and the pros and cons of increasing on-farm production as well as issues relating to energy and energy use, carbon foot-printing, arable crop production, composting and recycling, two tier standards, equivalence & level playing fields, antibiotics, etc.
