

Farm Woodland Forum 2022 Bursaries

To attend the 2022 annual meeting 16-17 June in Bangor



If you would love to join us for our annual get together but are faced with a financial barrier then we can help. The Farm Woodland Forum is offering a number of bursaries to attend the Annual Farm Woodland Forum meeting in Bangor on the 16th and 17th June 2022. We target our support at farmers, students and those from diverse and underrepresented backgrounds.

Student Bursary - The Farm Woodland Forum are offering two “Lynton Incoll Scholarship” bursaries of up to £200 (or equivalent in Euros) each towards receipted travel, accommodation and conference costs for students registered in the UK or Ireland to attend the Farm Woodland Forum Annual Meeting to be held at Bangor on 16th and 17th of June 2022. The title of the meeting this year is “Are we finally rolling the agroforestry log over the crest of the hill”. There will be sessions on sensors and technology in agroforestry, policy and other mechanisms to increase uptake of agroforestry, and agroforestry in practice; as well as a day of field visits to demonstration farms. The successful student would be expected to present a poster and to write a short report on their reflections on the meeting for the Farm Woodland Forum website. Applicants should send a poster abstract, a brief biography and a supporting letter from a course Director or Supervisor to Jo Smith (josmith@mvarc.eu) by 31 May 2022.

Farmer bursary - The Farm Woodland Forum are offering two bursaries of up to £200 (or equivalent in Euros) each towards receipted travel, accommodation and conference costs for farmers based in the UK or Ireland to attend the Annual Meeting.
